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### **Supporting learners with ALN in Mainstream** *Angela Coates*

The ALN reform act (Wales) has placed statutory obligations on schools to decide if a pupil has ALN or not.

How confident are you in meeting the needs of all learners in your class?

This course will look at good practice in the mainstream classroom. You will learn about various strategies and ways to attune to your pupil's needs. You will have the opportunity to access observations made by specialist teaching. These will be presented as examples for you to take back to school and support pupils who may be struggling or identified as having ALN.

The course will cover:

- Awareness of various additional learning needs (including Oppositional Defiance Disorder and Pathological Demand Avoidance)
- Strategies/Targets for various Additional Learning Needs e.g. channelling behaviours.
- Awareness of different tools for measuring progress
- Points of reference for breaking down goals into smaller steps

- Interpreting behaviours
- Attuning to individual pupil needs

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## **Creating Independent Learners** *Cath Delve* Creating and improving independent learning skills in young children.

ESTYN Inspections are regularly recommending that children improve these skills but how do we achieve this on a day-to-day basis in our schools? Independence is far bigger than children not interrupting teachers...

We must ask ourselves:

What are we doing for these children that they could do for themselves-from the time that they come into school in the morning to the time that they go home?

The course will include many, many different systems routines and real-life examples of good practice. It also includes hints and tips that will enable schools to develop this vital life-long skill in their children.

It will cover many aspects of independence including:

- What does an independent child 'look like'
- How can we promote independence across both the school day and all areas of learning?
- What are the main barriers to creating independent learners from an adult's point of view and also from the children?
- How do we model, praise and reward it?
- The importance of adult behaviour in promoting independence- not over directing over dominating or over preparing
- How to set up a 'self-help' classroom-an environment that encourages independence
- The difference between a dependent learner and an independent one
- Maintaining standards through the promotion of independence

The course also includes time to reflect on your own current practice and gives you time to develop an action plan based on what you are already doing well, what you need to tweak and refine, and what you need to target going forward.

#### **Planning for Effective Progression**

Estyn states that effective schools "have a clear understanding of progression through their school's curriculum, collaborate regularly with other schools and settings to deepen their understanding of progression across schools and phases and share effective approaches to teaching and assessment". This programme looks at how teachers can plan for and assess progress in the short term, and in their medium-term planning whilst making the progress clear and explicit to the learners. Packed with simple and practical activities, this programme will make progress simple and clear.

- What does effective progress look like and how does the learner know?
- How do we plan for progression in the short term and the longer term?
- How can we develop effective medium-term planning to make progress clear to the learner?
- What strategies can we use in the class and across the school to make progress an integrated part of the learning process?
- What does good progress look like, and how does this link to effective professional dialogue?
