LIVE ONLINE: 20 Lively Ways to Improve Pupils' Writing (Afternoon 1-30-3.30 pm) Stephanie Vaughan Building a Writerly Classroom A half-day online course to refresh the teaching of writing.

When we show pupils the tricks of the writing trade – the guaranteed ways to write interesting and powerful text – we improve their writing and develop their confidence as novice writers. These techniques open the door to creativity and style by helping pupils to make choices during the composition process.

This course explores how to help pupils to write with flair. It will:

- Provide you with twenty ways to improve the quality of pupils' writing
- Help teachers to give high quality advice about how to craft richer and more varied sentences
- Explore techniques to help pupils to describe with increasing detail
- Investigate exciting texts to mentor and inspire pupils to mirror the writing of professionals.

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LIVE ONLINE: Drama for Oracy (Afternoon 1.30 to 3.30pm) Patrice Baldwin

This course will explain how class teachers can set up a Drama lesson, to intentionally provide contexts and opportunities, for children to practise and develop their oracy skills. During Drama, children are often stimulated and highly motivated to speak purposefully. Drama gives them opportunities to practise and gain confidence, at speaking in different styles and registers, for a range of purposes and audiences. During this session, some key Drama strategies will be presented as 'Talk Frames' that use various configurations, groupings, and talk protocols. Also, ways in which drama strategies can be sequenced to better support oracy, will be suggested. The Additional Learning Needs transformation programme came into practice on the 1st of September 2021. The idea was to create a unified approach for young people from the age of 0-25. An important part of this system is accurate and relevant assessment of Additional Learning Needs of pupils already identified as needing extra support. It is also important to develop screening systems within the mainstream setting in order to recognise needs in pupils that might not be presenting their additional learning needs in an obvious way in class.

We will explore different Assessments and ensure that practitioners have a plethora of tools to assist in ascertaining the needs of all pupils.

LIVE ONLINE: Effective Use of Support Staff for children with ALN (Afternoon 1.30pm-3.30pm) Angela Coates

At the time of writing there are over 500,000 teacher support staff in the UK education system with approximately 31,000 of these being registered with the Education Workforce Council (EWC) in Wales and approximately 18,000 of these working in primary schools in Wales where they are now a larger section of the workforce than teaching staff (Department for Education, 2018; Education Workforce Council, 2017). As you can see above, it is vital that these members of staff are used effectively. This course will look at good practice in the mainstream classroom. You will learn about various strategies and ways to effectively use your staff to support children with ALN.

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LIVE ONLINE: Using Whole Class and Paired Reading to Boost Comprehension (Afternoon 1-30-3.30 pm) Stephanie Vaughan Supporting Pupils to Become

Independent, Thoughtful Readers

A half-day online course to enhance the teaching of reading comprehension.

When we scaffold our reading instruction to include teacher modelling, whole class discussion and purposeful pair and group work, we allow pupils to learn and practise the comprehension skills necessary for independence.

In this session, we will consider how to:

- Use talk to build a supportive, positive community of readers
- Slow down the reading process so that pupils can identify and understand how they make meaning whilst reading
- Identify a sequence of activities to move from whole class discussion to group and/or paired text investigations
- Create anchor charts that capture pupils' learning and thinking in the language they use.
